Shelter Gives Abused Kids a Chance

If your daughter got sick, would you write her off as hopeless? If your son was hurt in a car wreck, would you skip the rehab because he was too ruined to recover? Absolutely not! You would do everything in your power to help them get better. You would make sure they had treatment, support and comfort.

So how do we help the children who are physically and emotionally sick from abuse and neglect? The kids that find themselves alone? This is the mission of Open Arms Shelter...to give these children the support they need in a comfortable setting surrounded by people who care.

"When kids are welcomed into a safe, structured place where they are loved and nurtured, they often thrive," says Nancy Hamlin, director of Open Arms. "Many abused and neglected children can recover from the hardships that brought them here."

Yet there are decent, well-intended people that assume victims of child abuse and neglect are "ruined" or "permanently damaged." Some people think when children are abused it destroys their innocence and they are destined to carry on the cycle of abuse. And it is easy to understand why people have this reaction to the cruelty of abuse. It's hard to imagine getting over something so cruel and destructive. Children can recover, but they don't do well without help. And the help they need is pretty much what all children require to prosper—security, love, support and hope.

The Open Arms Shelter offers a safe place to begin this process for abused and neglected children from all over Arkansas, and the Board and staff are continually seeking to improve ways to give these kids a chance at a better way of life. Scary-oke Celebrity Karaoke Bash


